SAFETY & SECURITY

We appreciate your cooperation in ensuring smooth traffic flow in and around the school, especially during morning drop-offs. CCA ATTENDANCE

We thank you for your support of your daughter's/ward's participation in the school's co-curricular activities (CCAs).

CCAs play a vital role in a student's holistic development, offering opportunities to build character, develop skills and knowledge, and forge strong friendships. Continued involvement in CCAs is recognised under the LEAPS 2.0 framework, where students may attain one or two bonus points that can be used for admission to junior colleges, polytechnics or the Institute of Technical Education.

We would like to emphasize the importance of regular attendance at CCAs, even during periods when students have weighted assessments (WAs). As communicated via Parents Gateway on 24 Jan, WAs are spread across several weeks within a term and serve as regular bite-sized checkpoints to help both students and teachers assess their learning progress. They are not intended to be mini-examinations for which all other aspects of school life come to a halt.

As such, students will generally not be excused from CCAs to prepare for their WAs. We appreciate your understanding and support in this matter.

Quality results for these subjects require commitment and consistent effort on the part of students. It is thus essential for the girls to pace themselves well to submit quality coursework in time.

Science Practical Timed Practice & Consultations

We mentioned in last term's IJ Quarterly that Science practical lessons and consultations for other subjects will be held in the last week of the June holidays (23–26 Jun). O-Level Science students will have practical lessons on one, two or three days, depending on the number of Science subjects they are taking. Families of graduating students are thus advised to avoid scheduling overseas trips and other events during that week. More details will be given in due course.

Structured Intensive Revision (SIR)

The school will be conducting SIR in Term 3 for selected graduating students, to provide them with support that best matches their learning needs. The sessions will take place on Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Fridays, from 1500 to 1700. Students who are identified by their subject teachers for SIR will be notified by the end of Term 2 and they will be required to attend all the sessions. Students who are unable to attend the sessions will need to submit a letter from their parents/guardians to justify their absence.
